Potted Hyacinths and potted Snowdrops are two bulb varieties catching the buyers’ eyes, whilst “Tete-a-tete” Narcissi seem to go under the radar. Primrose sales are highly volatile, starting the week off steadily dropping like a stone by Thursday. Potted Roses sell in healthy volumes. This week’s top draw is a cracking collection of colossal Camellias standing at well over five foot tall.
